Launching a Schoolwide Reading Culture

Michele used a thoughtful, structured rollout to quickly build momentum and get students and teachers excited about Beanstack.

- **Strategic student introductions**: She first presented Beanstack to 6th graders during their media orientation, where it caught on immediately. Then, instruction was built into 7th- and 8th-grade orientations to build school-wide awareness.
- Teacher presence and early buy-in: Teachers stayed in the media center during visits, so they learned the platform alongside students—leading to consistent classroom support for logging and reading routines.
- **Ongoing teacher support:** Michele periodically pops into professional development meetings to answer questions, highlight accountability tools, and share quick tech tips.
